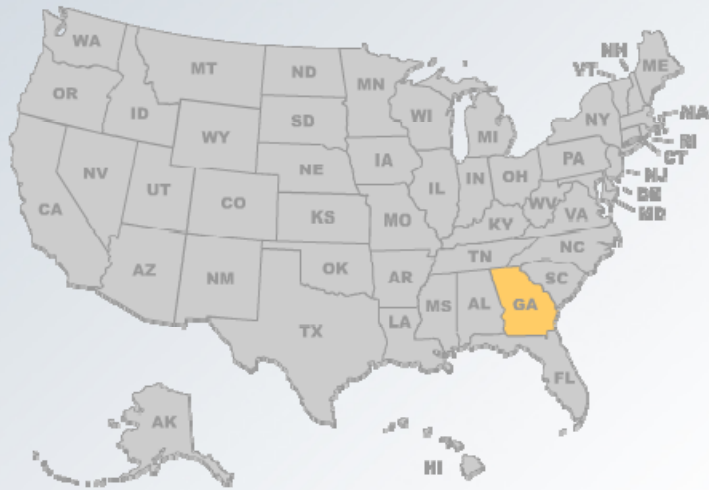

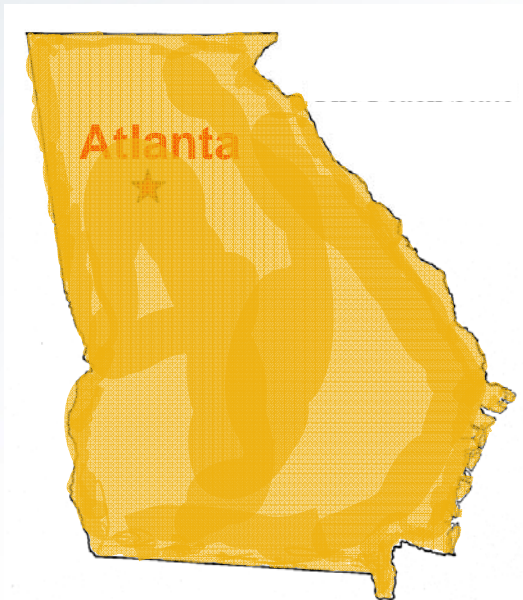

Atlanta is the capital city of the state of Georgia in the southeastern United States. The metropolitan Atlanta region is the 8th largest in the US, with 5.4 million residents. Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport is the world's busiest airport. Atlanta is the world headquarters of Coca-Cola, Delta Air Lines, and UPS.

Atlanta rose to prominence as a railroad hub during the American Civil War. Its capture by Union Gen. Sherman in 1864 was a severe blow to the Confederate cause.

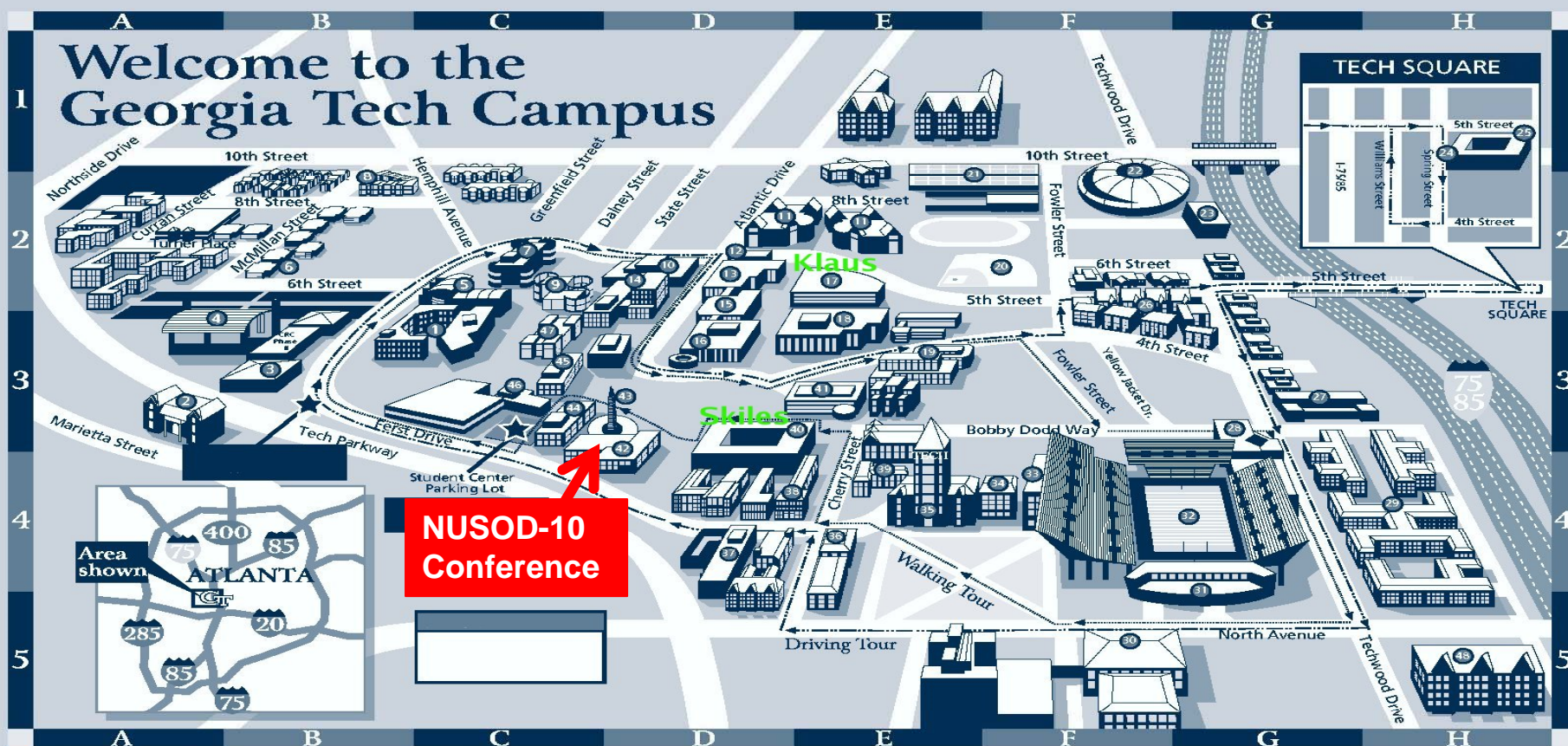

By air: Fly to Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport. Once at the airport, there are multiple ways to reach the Georgia Tech, such as

By shuttle: Service from Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson airport to the hotel is available. The Atlanta Link picks up at the hotel at :15 and :45 past the hour, every hour from 6:00 am – 1:00 am, 7 days a week. All service after 7:00 pm requires advance reservations.

By car: Take Interstate 85/75 north to the Spring/West Peachtree streets exit (#249D). Stay in the left lane as you exit on to Linden Avenue. Continue straight for 0.1 miles on Linden Avenue and turn left onto West Peachtree Street. Travel 0.3 miles and turn left onto 5th Street. Go one block and turn left on to Spring Street (Barnes & Noble Bookstore on your left). The Georgia Tech Hotel and Conference Center will be on your right. Proceed a half block and turn right at the next light into the parking deck.

By Taxi: Taxi service from the airport is conveniently located just outside the baggage claim areas.

By Rail (Option 1): Take the MARTA (Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority) rail from the Atlanta Airport to the North Avenue MARTA transit station. It is a 20-minute ride. Walk three blocks west on North Avenue to campus. At the intersection of North Avenue and Fowler Street, ascend the stairs under the archway and take an immediate right. Follow the path to the Student Center.

By Rail (Option 2): Take the MARTA rail from the Atlanta Airport to the Midtown MARTA transit station. Georgia Tech's complimentary shuttle, the Tech Trolley, provides guests transportation arriving and departing from the Midtown MARTA transit station. The Tech Trolley will run 5:45 a.m. until 11:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, Saturday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Sunday, 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. See detailed schedule at:
